Hístorían's Column

In recent months, I've been asked a few questions that has set me to thinking along a path that I want to share with you. As I write this during the week before Christmas, I am thinking about these questions, our church, and my life.



We are in a time and space that calls for these thoughts. Our church is in a time of transition. One minister has left. We've had a bridge minister who has helped us prepare for our next pastor. For me, working with her has been very helpful. I have been enjoying learning about our church's history and how it fits in with the history of the area and our country's history. There is much more to learn and I still am able to climb the stairs to the second floor of the Wolcott Building. I'm not ready to pass this job off to another. Also, the position is not ready for me to leave it in another's hands.

That brings us to the first question: Who would you suggest as our next historian? I answered with the names of the people who have helped in the archive. I do not know who would like to have the position. I do need to be grooming people. At this point in the organization of our archive we could use a committee or at least an assistant historian. We are a historic church in transition. Knowing our history gives us a foundation to build on as we shape our future.

I want to move on to another question. It was asked by Pastor Dean as I gave a brief tour of Main Street: Why did the colonist come to Connecticut? Yes, we need to know a bit of the history that laid the ground for the settlers who braved coming to Connecticut and then choosing to live on this side of the river. They had options. The land was parceled out by lottery. Each family received more than one parcel. The land on the flood plain on this side of the river was so rich and fertile that they choose to center their efforts here. Everyone had a garden and raised their own food or at least part of it during the early years.

On the front of our church building a is small sign that proclaims that we are the Timothy Edwards Church. That begs for us to ask, "How does that matter to us today? How has it mattered?" One tangible thing comes to mind: In 1969, a teenaged congregant suggested the name for the middle school be the Timothy Edwards Middle School.
