Sue and Lee will be working together for the rest of the year to transition all of Lee's duties to either Sue or the Don Brooks Agency, with the goal of having this completed by year end.


Christian Education

Hístorían's Column

Last month we learned that when East Windsor was incorporated, our name changed to the First Ecclesiastical Society of South Windsor. We held that name from 1846 -1898. Our name did not give an accurate picture of what we had become. Our name was



give an accurate picture of what we had become. Our name was not changed in 1818 as it should have been in response to the state constitution of that time. The state constitution changed the relationship between church and state. For background about the change that made our name obsolete, we need to remember the major changes in this country. Ah, yes, we were no longer a colony but rather a country. Representatives wrote the Articles of Confederation. The need for a stronger Federal Government soon became apparent and eventually led to the Constitutional Convention in 1787.

In our colonial days, the use of the term Ecclesiastical in the name reflected the relationship of church and state. In colonies like Connecticut, the people living in a town paid a tax to support that both church and town. Usually, there was one building which served as the meeting house for both. The name reflected that there was no separation of church and state.

The United States Constitution's first amendment, states that Congress will make no law respecting an establishment of religion or prohibiting its free exercise. Connecticut wrote its first state constitution in 1818. It had simply been using the amended colonial constitution.

The CT Constitution of 1818 addressed issues of religion in two different ways. First, Section 3 of the Declaration of Rights provided that the "exercise and enjoyment of religious profession and worship without discrimination, shall forever be free to all persons in this state" [but that right] "shall not be so construed as to excuse acts of licentiousness or justify practices inconsistent with the peace and safety of the state." Second, Article 7 addressed taxpayer support of churches.

In 1898, the Ecclesiastical Society of South Windsor was dissolved and the property transferred to the organization incorporating as First Congregational Church of South Windsor. Oh Wow! A new name and a new organization ready for a new century with the same people and the same buildings.

A rose is a rose assumes that we are still naming a rose. What if the rose has been transformed into something different just as our religious organization? I think the church congregation stopped us as an Ecclesiastical Society long before the formal change. It probably changed when they had to start supporting the town and the church separately. Throughout the church notes from 1850 on I have found little use of the name of the church. The Church Notes records for the annual meetings simply started with "The Annual Meeting of the Church,." and continued by stating time and place. After the Wolcott Memorial Chapel was built for the church. the annual meetings were often held there.

So, are we still a rose?
