Are You Wondering?

The power of wondering depends on if you wonder, when, or wonder if. Dear faith travelers, why do we wonder? Wondering takes away the resistance and is a powerful thought experiment! After all, you're only wondering, no harm in that. There is nothing to fight against, thus, just wondering is a passive cognitive exercise. But when we see, for example, change and growth in us or in our church, wondering becomes 'active' engagement. I wonder IF this change in me or our church is a good sign. Now, wondering when is an active, speculative exercise that, instead of wondering if something will happen, wondering when presupposes it will; it is a very powerful process because it assures that good change and positive growth 'will occur'!

When we choose if or when, it makes a difference in how our vision for ourselves and our church develops. When we choose to wonder, then we expect blessings to come our way by faith. Wondering if has an elemental doubt, as if waiting to see if what is coming is a good thing!

Both of these thought experiments can change our lives here at First Church dramatically. When we wonder when the blessings will happen, we demonstrate our collective faith in our vision, mission, and future mission to our community. I wonder when each of you will add this powerful and transformative approach to your prayers. I wonder what's next.

Welcome, Our New Member!

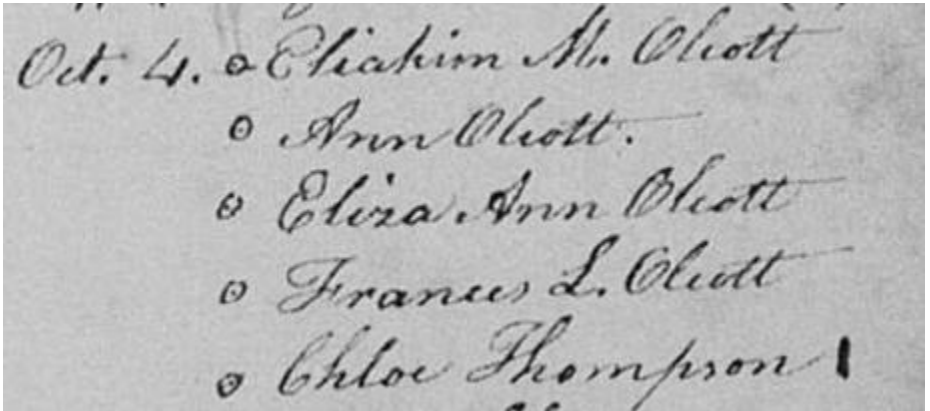

Church Historian

This month, I want to share a letter that was written 125 years ago by an elderly member of our congregation, Francis L. Olcott, in response to an invitation to attend the Annual Meeting. She, her parents and sister joined our church in 1840 when they transferred their membership from the Windsor Church. Our records in Church Notes show in the list of those who joined in 1840 the following:



Turning to the Center Cemetery Alpha List of tombstones found we find the Record for Francis L. Olcott

Olcott, Francis L, b. c.1821, d. May 18, 1846, Age 89

That doesn't add up: 1821 plus 89 would be 1910, and we received a letter from her in 1900. The date on the stone must not have been clear/readable. Be that as it may, let's get on to her letter:

"Dear Friends, Thanks for the invitation to the annual meeting of the members of the congregational Church in South Windsor. Should be pleased to be with you, but as I shall not be able, will write a few lines as my name comes first in the list of members in our new Manual. My mind goes back to that day. It was October 4th, 1840, that I was received to membership in the East, now South Windsor Congregational Church, by letter from the First Congregational Church, Windsor, Connecticut. There were about 100 members. Reverend Lewis Smith, pastor. The old meeting house, built in 1761, was then standing and continued to be used for public worship until May 17th, 1846, when it was used for the last time. Reverend Mr.

Smith's text was Ecclesiastes 3:3, "A time to break down and a time to build up." Reverend Dr. Robins spoke from Isaiah 5:4, "What could have been done more to my vineyard, that I have not done in it." We looked with something of sadness, knowing that the house where our fathers had worshiped was doomed to be seen no more, but the present edifice was built the same year and dedicated Dec. 23, 1846. Reverend Smith's text was Psalms 23:6. "I will dwell in the house of the Lord for ever". I hardly know what to write as expression of my interest in the church, so I send this bit of history which I am glad to remember with many good wishes for the prosperity of the church. I remain very sincerely your friend in the bonds of the Gospel."

The Missions Committee thanks all who participated in our Christmas Gift Card collection for MACC (Manchester Area Conference of Churches) families. We sponsored a total of 23 people for the Christmas holiday dinners and Christmas gifts.

I am overwhelmed by our congregation's generosity this holiday season. From the emergency food collection for MACC to the Thanksgiving food collection for Cornerstone and then to the Christmas Gift Card collection for MACC clients, members of First Church have responded with an outpouring of support to help our most vulnerable neighbors during these difficult times.

We are in need of additional prayer shawls for our ministry. If you knit or crochet, instructions and yarn are available in the lower hall closet. The shawls are presented to women to comfort them when they are struggling with issues such as a medical crisis or grief, (Men receive fleece throws). We have received positive feedback from people who are grateful to have received the shawls and want to continue this ministry, but making them is time-consuming and we need your help. If you have any questions, please ask a member of the Missions Committee.

The Missions Committee is purchasing items to make hot cocoa packets with peppermint sticks and mini marshmallows – February 15th, after coffee hour - for the Hands on Hartford Nutritional Backpack program. These backpacks are provided to children who receive free breakfast and lunch in school but are at risk of going hungry on weekends. Please spend a few minutes helping us assemble the packets after church to give these children a treat.

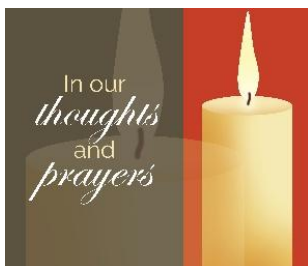
